A Word of Devotion:

ENCOUNTERING GOD THROUGH THANKSGIVING

"Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name!"

Psalm 100:4

Thanksgiving is a gift given to us by the good and loving nature of our heavenly Father. In and out of every season of life, we have a reason to give thanks because we serve a wholly faithful, good, and loving God. We serve the only King who would lay down his life for his unworthy, rebellious servants. We serve a God perfectly worthy of all the thanksgiving and praise we could possibly give. In using the incredible gift of thanksgiving, we remind ourselves of how truly good our Father is. In thanksgiving, we experience the joy of a proper perspective and have our hearts stirred by the renewing of our minds. 

Second Harvest Season at Ambwere Farm

The second harvesting season at the Friends United Meeting Sustainability Farm (the Ambwere Farm in Kenya) commenced on September 30th 2025.

This week marks the third week since harvesting began.

This season, farm workers planted 800 acres of maize on our 902-acre property, with the remaining acres being occupied by roads, forests, and storage buildings. We managed to get a combine harvester to do our harvesting and, unlike last season where we used four machines, this time around we are only utilizing one machine for our harvest. This allows for easy, proper, and effective monitoring and management as we carry out our harvesting with a key aim of minimizing or reducing wastage and losses.

396- Patience is a virtue everywhere; but it shines with great luster in the men of government.

397 & 398- Some are so proud or testy, they won't hear what they should redress. Others so weak, they sink or burst under the weight of their office, though they can lightly run away with the salary of it.

399- Business can never be well done, that is not well understood: which cannot be without patients.



This expression coming from the writing of George Fox has been much misused, but some consideration of it may be helpful.

"Does not every person have a soul? Who creates the soul? To whom does the soul of man belong by right of creation? Granted that men may become horribly sinful, were they created so, or did they willfully become so? Does God create "totally depraved" souls? Why, or why not?

Shall the concept of sacredness be restricted to certain people of whom we approve, suspending our testimony in war time, in conflict situations and when our "best interests" are involved? Can Christians at any time rightfully call "enemies" mad-dogs and demons? Where there is difficulty in affirming that of God in every man, we can at least, as a beginning, affirm that of God in the other person... Most likely this individual needs this affirmation, and will prophet richly by it!"



Quakers use the term Query to refer to a question or series of questions used for reflection and in spiritual exercises. Friends have used Queries as tools for offering spiritual challenges to the community for much of their history.

Consider this...

-Do I care for the reputation of others, refraining from gossip or disparaging remarks?

-Am I committed to the difficult work of forgiveness, and affirming God's love for the whole community?


