

#### FIBC Food Security Project 2024 - Report 3

DISTRIBUTING FOOD ITEMS IN THE COMMUNITY OF KELLHUANI

Families of the community Kellhuani make a living by raising llamas

On Friday, June 28 we distributed food in the community of Kellhuani. Early in the morning we began with uploading the food such as rice, sugar and oil on a big car. All food was purchased from the city of El Alto for this community. The indigenous authorities of this community helped us in the whole process of this distribution day. For example, they made sure that the food items arrived in a good condition to the community of Kellhuani.

There were three young volunteers to travel to this community. After we finished uploading the food items,

we took a different public transportation to get to the community of Chachacumani, which is the nearest town to the community of Kellhuani. One of the local authorities named Wilfredo joined us for this trip to rural area. And after two hours of traveling we finally arrived to this town in order to take a car to Kellhuani, which is located on top of a low mountain. Kellhuani is a rather cold and dry place. The houses there are a little distance from each other. It has a small soccer field and a small elementary school. Local people make a living by raising llamas and growing potatoes. Last year it was hard for them due to the potato crop failure in the highlands.

Some of the families were already gathered when we got there. They greeted us with welcoming words, happy that we reached out to their community with this help to sustain their families. Once most of the families gathered, we started with a distribution program. First, we introduced ourselves. Second, we read a letter from FIBC stating the importance of helping with food to their community. Next, we had a brief worship service of gratitude to God for all food items. After that, we sang two songs and one of the volunteers shared the word of God with the families by reading a Bible passage. During the reading time we gave the families small flyers with the word of God, too. Finally, we ended the program with a prayer.

Then the families of the community, in gratitude, brought "apthapi", which consists of each person bringing some food to share in small typical blankets. These blankets are put on the ground with the food. To me, the good thing about an apthapi is that it is like a buffet so everyone gets whatever they want and the amount they want. But to the locals the apthapi makes it possible for everyone to have some food because everyone takes what they need, but no more.

After the lunch with an apthapi was over, we began with distribution. We called each family according to the family list. We verified their identity card before each family received 25 pounds of sugar, 25 pounds of rice and 5 liters of oil. That day, 36 families benefited from the food security project, a total of 109 adults and children. The families were very happy and grateful for the food items given to them. Also, one of the local women from the community expressed her gratitude for hearing the word of God in that place. And when it was time to say goodbye, they sent many greetings and blessings to the Quaker brothers and sisters who made the help with the food items possible.

I am very grateful to God for being part of the volunteering team. For me, every time I learn something new as I go to do this volunteering work. Local people are so grateful for getting this type of support for their families. Also, for me it is a blessing to be a volunteer because I am getting to know new places, getting to know how families live in these far communities, and how difficult life can be because of the drought in the highlands. All of these experiences help me to be more grateful for the things God gave me. I feel happy doing this work since it is both helping others and bringing them the word of God, which is the most important thing to share as we reach out with love to the families in these communities. I am really grateful to Friends who support this project. May God bless you greatly!

#### Checks and Balances:

As indicated elsewhere in these studies, no one is infallible. Individuals, both inside and outside the society of friends, have tried to justify conduct incompatible with the teachings of Jesus. Checks and balances are needed. Friends have been wise in selecting such tests:

#### 1. Reasonableness and Clear Thinking:

The possibility of being mistaken is ever with us, and our Quaker honesty keeps us searching diligently for the truth.

#### 2. The Bible:

When something is not in keeping with the spirit and teaching of Jesus, it should be examined further.

#### 3. The Worshiping Fellowship:

Friends insist that group wisdom is needed. For this reason a meeting for business begins with worship and continues in a spirit of worship. The ideal is finding unity in truth as revealed by the Holy Spirit.

## Meet our Missions Belize



Historically, FUM's work in Belize focused primarily on providing a second-chance education option for urban at-risk youth on the verge of failing within their school system. Founded by Sadie Vernon in 1994, the Belize Friends School gives boys and girls the encouragement, tools and instruction needed to succeed, all within a loving, Christian environment. Now under the leadership of Belizean educators, the school continues to impact the lives of students and their families.

More recently, a new and expanded vision for Belize has emerged and begun to bear good fruit. A large new facility allows for the growth of the school and the launch of new types of community-based ministries. With a church planting pastor now on-site, a multi-generational worshiping community of Christ-followers is starting to flourish and consider how they are being called to minister within the Southside of Belize City. Programs for teaching peace and conflict resolution, literacy education for adults, and police-community mediation are increasingly integral to the mission presence of Friends in Belize.
