A Word of Devotion:

EMBRACING NEW BEGINNINGS

‘ Behold, I am doing a new thing: now it
springs forth, do you not perceive it? I
will make a way in the wilderness and
rivers in the desert.’

-Isaiah 43:19

Easter is one of the most important holidays for Christians, celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ after his crucifixion. It's a time when we gather with our families, enjoy chocolate bunnies, and maybe even attend church. But beyond the traditions, Easter also holds a powerful message for us about new beginnings and the power of positive thinking. No matter your yesterdays, God has a future planned for you. A future that is full of hope. Embrace God's gift of hope for you. The chance at a new beginning—that is what Easter is all about.

Jeremiah 29:11 says, "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope."

Easter is also a time of new beginnings. Just as Jesus' resurrection signaled a fresh start for humanity, it can be a chance for us to reflect on our own lives and make positive changes. 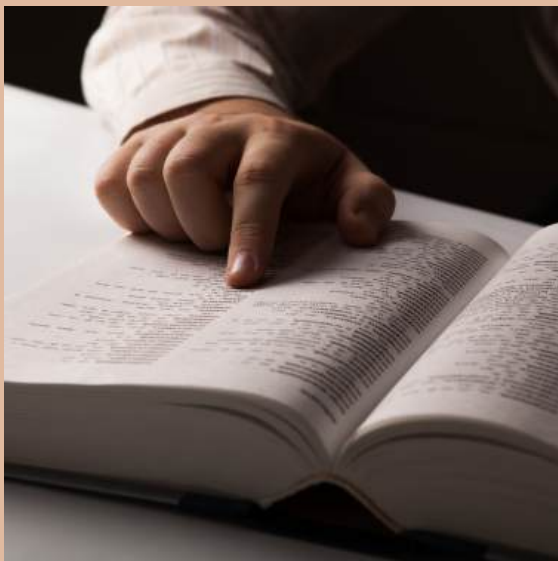

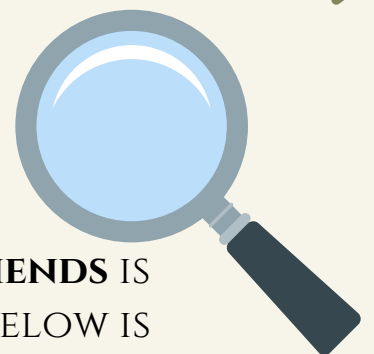

The new Beneficial Ownership Information Report (BOIR) requirement and are you exempt?



If you are getting the emails to any church email that you might have on your website, then let me tell you about this new requirement. All of our churches that have a 501(c)(3) are safe and DO NOT have to do this report.

info@friendschurchnc.org and my own email paul@friendschurchnc.org have been bombarded with compliance emails of needing to report. The company that wants to "help" us will do so for a charge. However, don't believe the "helper" emails, you can file for free! They give you the scare tactic that it will cost \$593 a day if we do not file by March 21, 2025. That is all correct, if we weren't a 501(c)(3). Also, if you are reading this and have a small business you will be held to those fines if you do not file. When you look up any information on this, they list the deadline as January 1, 2024 but due to a lawsuit that didn't complete until recent it was delayed until March 21, 2025. Do you think you might have filed already? You can go to the website below and check by trying to file again. They will let you know you have already filed and send a confirmation email. The government website <https://boiefiling.fincen.gov/> will let you check or file. What is the BOIR and why is this important? I wanted to pass along a quick bit of information about the BOIR:

The Beneficial Ownership Information Report (BOIR) is a crucial requirement introduced under the Corporate Transparency Act (CTA) for businesses in the United States. The BOIR ensures transparency in ownership structures and plays a significant role in combating financial crimes, such as money laundering. Quick Details and Key Points About the BOIR: it is mandated by: Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN), applies to: Most U.S. businesses, has a filing deadline: March 21, 2025 and penalties are steep up to \$593 per day for failure to file.

To sum up this all if you have a small business and have a website you need to file. Any church that has a website and is a 501(c)(3) you are safe. If you need to file you can for free. Hope this helps those of you with businesses and keeps all our churches safe from any running "helper" emails that will try to phish you into using their service.

Refugee Quakers in Uganda Affected by Changes in U.S. Aid



Recently, a unique congregation of Quakers gathered in a corrugated iron sheet walled Church building passionately sang a popular hymn called "Umugisha" ("Blessing") in a mix of Kinyarwanda and Kirundi languages, making me think of the famous Negro spirituals because of the compelling rhythm, melody, tempo, and emotional depth of the lyrics:

Gusenga kwanjye kukugereho
Mana uri amahoro yangye
Ndagukeneye ku manywa na nijoro
Mu bihe byose umbe hafi
Gusenga kwanjye kukugereho...

May my prayers reach you
God, you are my peace
I need you day and night
Be near me at all times
May my prayers reach you...

Meet our Missions Ramallah Friends School



In 1869, a 15-year old Palestinian girl named Miriam Karam mustered up the courage to ask two Quaker visitors to Ramallah, Eli and Sybil Jones, to start a girl's school in the area. At that time, no education program existed for women in this region. Before long, a medical mission and boarding school for girls was in place. By 1902, a similar boarding school for boys was created by Friends.
