PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. 1 Peter 4:8

I realize as I am writing this article, that as you all read it, we will be nearing "Autumn". However, as I am writing, we are in the heat of summer! That being said, my first month of summer has been hectic, and I have so many thoughts running through my mind as I am deciding what I want to say to you. So here are the "rambling thoughts" that are me!

Last year on our Reading List, there was a devotional book written by Bob Goff. Bob has only written three books, but this summer, one or all have been constantly in my hands. The titles of these books are Love Does, Everybody Always, and Live in Grace-Walk in Love. Now that I have read these books (multiple times), I can truly feel the power of those three simple titles, and if you truly think about them, you may feel a small part of that too. I've said all of that to say, that in everything that has transpired this summer I have seen the importance of living the way Bob Goff is describing.

This year, just a few weeks before Quaker Lake Camp's sessions began, Heather got in touch with Jan Dough and me, and told us she had someone back out for a week of Camp Pastor, and she was desperate. Ya'll know Jan and me, so you know the answer. I have done Discovery at QLC a few times, and it is honestly one of the biggest blessings in my life. I always get more from it, than the children probably get from us. This was Jan's first time, and she was nervous, but of course did a phenomenal job. Anyway, it was the first full week of camp, and my first week without grandkids, but my dear friend, Jan, worked so hard and put together some perfect ideas. We had five days of lessons with the greatest 11-, 12-, and 13-year-olds you can imagine. Even though Jan and I may not have felt as prepared as possible, we just loved those kids with all we had, and came out of camp, feeling a multitude of God's blessings.

During the next couple of weeks, we were preparing for family time over the holiday, and we had two good friends receive some tragic health diagnosis, that kind of rocked our world. One had major back pain that sent him to the hospital, and he hasn't returned home yet. He had a surgery that left him unable to use his legs, but after a few days it returned, and he is desperately working to relearn walking. Also, during this trip, they found he has a blood cancer they will treat later, and his 27-year-old daughter passed away. Honestly, all I have been able to do is love them and pray. Our second friend was almost a part of our family. He has worked with my husband 28 years, but he has helped our family with our home, for 10 or 12 years. My husband knew that something wasn't right and had encouraged him to go to the doctor, for almost a year. Finally, he had to make a trip to the hospital, and his prognosis was as bad as it gets. He chose not to do any treatments, and we had his Celebration of Life yesterday. This was a man who was simple, hard-working, and more giving than anyone you could possibly know. He was a construction worker, his wife works at a school, and the representation of people from both places was incredible. But the thing that touched me the most, was the fact that there probably wasn't a single person there that he had not DONE something for, because he LOVED them. It didn't matter who they were, he did whatever was needed for EVERYBODY ALWAYS.

The thing I could take away from this summer, is that the single most important thing to remember, is that, more than anything, I need to try and "love like Jesus". Bob Goff believes that more importantly than even pulling that duty at church, we need to try and "love like Jesus". That last friend of mine, he didn't do church. He didn't always use nice words, but he ALWAYS loved like Jesus, and he always DID what that love brought him to do. He did accept Jesus in those last few days when a local pastor visited, but you know what I think? I think he was on a straighter path than some of us, because, for a long, long time, he has loved like Jesus!

Save your used postage stamps to raise money for RIGHT SHARING OF WORLD RESOURCES's work and mission (rswr@rswr.org).

The stamp program now accepts stamps of all issue dates and countries, both used and unused stamps, sheets of stamps, albums or boxed collections of stamps.

Please note we are only able to process and sell stamps and not other collectibles (including greeting cards and postcards). In order for the stamps to be saleable please follow these guidelines:

FOREIGN STAMPS (excluding Canada):

These may be left on the postcard or envelope, especially if the envelope has some special drawing or indication of the country. There are collectors who like to receive a whole envelope or postcard with a foreign stamp.

USA AND CANADA STAMPS:

Cut the stamps off the envelope or postcard, leave the perforations on the stamps. Leave ¼ inch to 1/8 inch around the stamp so the whole stamp is preserved, including the perforations. When there is more than one stamp, treat the group as a unit.

All stamps are acceptable, but we want to be financially effective. Do not send nonprofit and/or presorted stamps.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH EDUCATION

"...Let the little children come to me; and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." Matthew 18:14 NIV

I have listened to lots of inspiring sermons through the years. Many of these have been delivered by particularly good speakers who obviously had spent quality time in preparation. These speakers were excellent communicators with just the right eye contact and appropriate body gestures to get the message and their ideas across effectively. Often times, I will take notes to help me recall meaningful thoughts. However, there have been times when the children's messages have been my greatest blessing.

It is during these times when the little ones walk up to the front of the sanctuary, the pastor or an appointed person sits on the steps and tell them a story about Jesus. The children wiggle, squirm, and often reposition themselves. The presenter reads a Bible verse and sometimes has the group repeat the verse. Often questions are asked to get feedback. There is always a simple truth about Jesus and His love. The children are assured and reminded of how much they are loved. A catchy song might be included to reinforce the simple lesson. The presenter always finishes the brief sermon with a prayer and most often the offer of a small treat before they head back to their seats.

The children demonstrate how to listen (for an abbreviated time), accept, and receive simple yet profound Biblical truths. They are little believers. They are not taking written notes, thinking about what they will be involved with later, analyzing or overthinking or any other adult concern. They are simply responding to what they have experienced in their way.

Watching these precious children is a reminder that I want a heart that expresses myself freely and honestly just as they do. I am grateful for the joy that each child brings to family members and friends.

Updates-

FEMAP-Work continues in the 12th year of Friends Emergency Material Assistance Program at Springfield Friends Meetinghouse. Since July 2023, more than 2,000 kits have been distributed. Most are hygiene kits with some of the farmworker, school and infant kits also. Along with the kits, over 200 quilts have been made and donated to homeless shelters or homes for mothers and children. Donations have come in from 15 Friends Meetings, not including monetary gifts and donations from others who know about this work. All donations are appreciated and any volunteers who come on Wednesdays from 10:00 to 2:00 to help assemble the kits are most welcome. Recently Femap received a huge donation of three pickup loads of fabric. Any of you sewers and quilters are encouraged to come see the fabric and join in the fun of making quilts!

Emma Condori, Director of Friends International Bilingual Center in La Paz, Bolivia, SA reports on the Food Security Project for 2024. The potato harvest in April, 2024 was good and a celebration was held by the families from five communities. These people were able to survive the potato famine in their country when they were given potatoes to eat, to plant and then to harvest this year. Several young adults from the Center volunteered to distribute the potatoes last fall to the families. They were invited to come to the celebration where various potato dishes were brought in by the families and a meal was enjoyed by all.
